(Questions and Scriptures for further study)

1. Have you ever been told from your employer not to share your faith at the place of employment? Do you assume it is a given? If so, what was your internal reaction? Did you simply give up or proactively prayed for an opportunity to share the gospel? Explain.

2. When was the last time you saw the Lord rescue you from an impossible situation? Can you share something that has happened in the last two months?

3. What best describes you in the following statements? **Statement A:** I will make myself available to the Lord's leading hoping it will incorporate in my daily scheduled plan. **Statement B:** I will be proactively praying for an opportunity to share the incredible life changing message of Jesus Christ resurrection from the dead. Discuss and be honest with one another.

4. In Acts 5:20, there are three imperatives: go, stand and tell. Look at Genesis 12:1 and Jonah 1:2. What were the two imperatives in these verses? What were the responses to those divine imperatives? What does the Lord expect from us today?

5. What does Jesus mean when He said, "Go and make disciples?" Do you think we go and **make** disciples, or simply go? List three reasons why we may go but have a difficult time making disciples? As a community group, challenge one another in the next few months to make disciples.

6. Have you ever been perplexed about what God was allowing in your life? What was the reason why you were perplexed? Could it be that His plans did not agree with your plans? Explain.
