

7. Read Acts 10:8. Do you have people in your life that you can be open with? Who? Are they Christian or non-Christian? Who have you been opening your heart and life for the purpose of reaching them for Christ?

8. Read Acts 10:34-48. Can you share the gospel clearly and powerfully to seekers? Why or why not? Are you willing to be trained? The discipleship journey will teach you how.

9. Read Luke 10:1-9. What principles do you see in these verses? Do you desire to be a worker in the harvest? Do you pray for workers? Who are your people of peace? Do you move around enough to build new relationships? Do you believe your community group has a desire to mobilize a bridge building movement?

Bridges To Build/Barriers To Break

A bridge is a **connector** that allows us to crossover a barrier.

I. Bridge building is in the **heart** of God. (II Corinthians 5:18&19)

II. Christ has **authorized** us to build bridges. (Matthew 28:19&20)

III. All Christians should have a **desire** to build bridges. (II Cor. 5:17)

IV. Christ has given and modeled a **strategic** plan for bridge building.

A. Open our **heart**. (Acts 10:1-8)

B. Open our **mouth**. (Acts 10:34-48; Luke 10:1-9)
