(Questions and Scriptures for further study)

1. If you were to take a look at your life as far as time goes, where would be the top 5 places you spend your time? Who are you hanging out with? Are they helping you find your purpose? Why or why not?

2. Take a moment and skim through the early chapters of Acts. What are some of the incredible stories that are documented here? What are some things that God is doing in your life and the lives of believers around you?

3. On a blank section of your paper, write out a few words describing God and then discuss why you wrote those things. Do we have a God worthy of talking about? How important is it to know God's Word...Joshua 1:8?

4. Read Acts 13:1-3. The believers were hanging out together with prophets and teachers. Why? How would they benefit the group? What would prophets and teachers talk about? Who in your group would you say has these gifts? What are some of the other gifts represented here in your CG tonight?

5. Why is it important that Luke (the author of Acts) lists some of the believers in their group? Is diversity good? What are some of the benefits that you see? How do we encourage diversity in our church, community groups and THRIVE?

6. In verse 2 of Acts 13, Luke says that "the Holy Spirit spoke"...what were the believers doing at the time? Why do you think that is important? When is the time that you hear from God the most? About the least? Why?

7. What are some ways we can "worship" the Lord by serving? (Romans 12:1) What ministries are you involved in now? What are some needs at Keystone/THRIVE church services that we can serve God in? Why don't we?
