7. Read II Thessalonians 2:5 and I Thessalonians 2:9. Are you in a relationship with another believer who models by being with you and reminding you? Are you modeling and reminding someone? Why?

## The Power Of Transitioning

- I. Transition is the **PASSAGE** from one stage to another.  
(I Corinthians 13:11; I Corinthians 15:51&52)

It's all about a **CHANGE** or shift.

- II. Change is **EXPECTED** if we are to grow.  
(Romans 12:2; II Corinthians 3:18)

- III. We all have a tendency to **RESIST** change. (Acts 6:14)

- IV. The powerful change in **EPHESUS**. (Acts 18:18-19:7)

- A. Transitioning is about **DECREASING** in something so we can **INCREASE** in something. (John 3:30)
- B. Transitioning is most effective with **RELATIONAL** reminders. (II Thessalonians 2:5; I Thessalonians 2:9)
